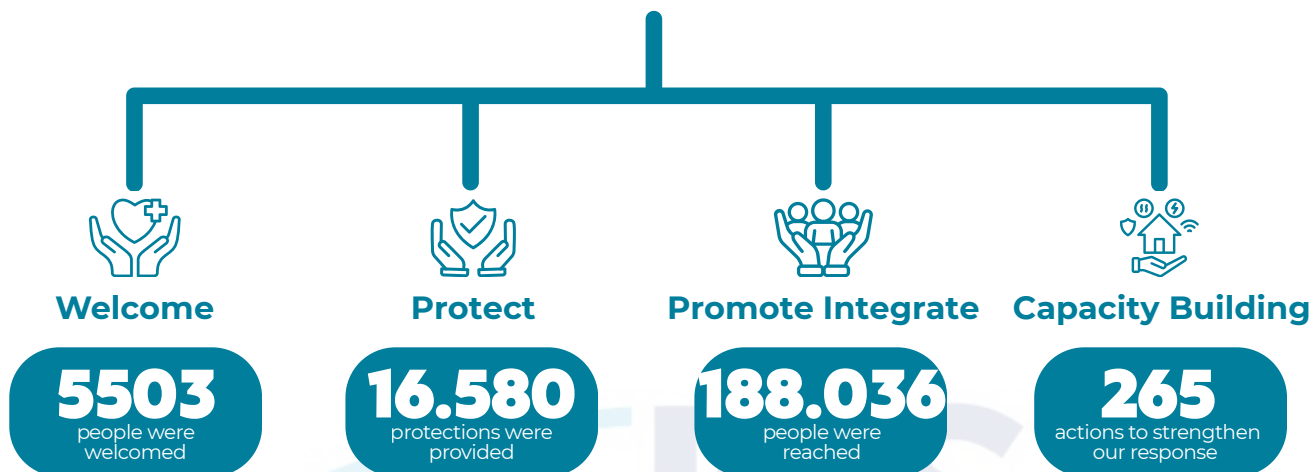


ONE PROPOSAL ANNUAL REPORT

Jesuit response to Ukraine Crisis | 2025

In 2026 the conflict in Ukraine has entered its fifth year, with **10.8 million people** still in need of assistance and 2025 recorded as the deadliest year for civilians. Across Europe, **4.35 million** Ukrainians remain under Temporary Protection, while **3.7 million** are internally displaced and poverty inside Ukraine stands at 36.9%. In some nations TPD has been extended up to march 2027, but its future is unclear. While integration remains the primary sector of intervention, 2025 saw a surge in requests within the protection sector, driven by the impoverishment and erosion of beneficiaries' savings, the protracted nature of the conflict, and a reduction in support from both NGOs and local governments.

The One Proposal project is dedicated to assisting individuals:

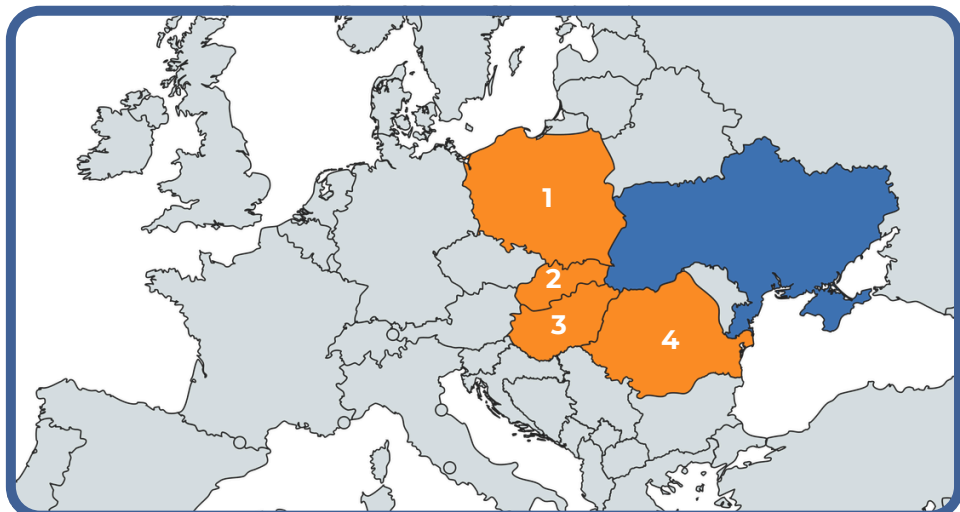
1. Internally Displaced People (IDPs)

4. People belonging to the local communities



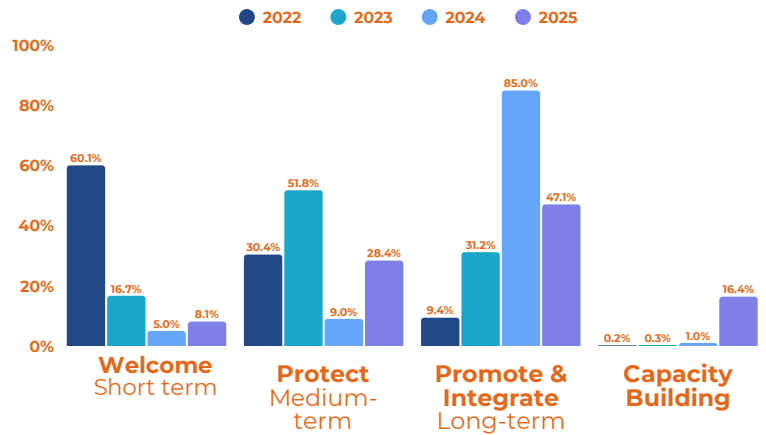

In Ukraine is present also the **L'Arche-Kovcheh**, a JRS partner supporting people with disabilities and health special needs in Lviv.



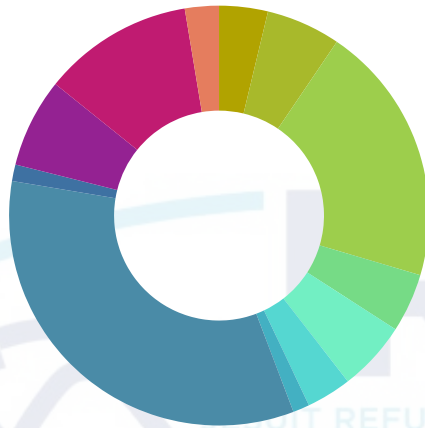
Activities overview



In 2025, the budget for protection services more than tripled, increasing from 9% to 28.4% of total expenditure.
